# **RECORD-BREAKING DONATIONS**

CIS held its 6<sup>th</sup> Annual "Stuff the Bus" school supply drive on tax-free weekend in August at Walmart and Staples in Morehead City as well as at a Morehead City Marlins game in an effort to provide school supplies for our most at-risk students in Carteret County. For the first time ever, CIS collaborated with Salvation Army to unify county efforts and meet the needs of students more effectively.

Volunteers collected over \$30,000 worth of school supplies, and Boys & Girls Club members unloaded the donations at the Carteret County Association of Realtors office. Chickfil-A provided coupons to donors and lunch to volunteers. On Distribution Day, **716 children** received school supplies to start their school year on the right foot. Stuff the Bus 2011 was a record-breaking year for donations, volunteers, partnerships, recipients, and has set the stage for greater success in the future!

## **Down East After School**

For the fourth year, students from our 21st Century Community Learning Center programs at Smyrna, Atlantic and Harkers Island Elementary continue to be enriched in their after-school programs! 90 at-risk students receive daily afterschool homework assistance, remediation, and enrichment activities from our CIS Site Teams. Overall, 76% of students have grown academically this year!



## Hand In Hand After School

The "Hand In Hand" After School Program ran for 5 months during the 2011-2012 school year. HIH targeted at risk students from three middle schools. Two certified teachers at each middle school provided homework assistance and remediation at Broad Creek, Morehead, and Newport Middle Schools. A total of 75 students were served, and the overall academic improvement was 95%. The student who showed the highest overall improvement was an 8<sup>th</sup> grade student at Newport Middle who increased by 105 points in language arts, math, science, and social studies.

# One Plus One Lunch Buddies

Thanks to a grant from the Department of Juvenile Justice, 25 students at Newport Elementary, who struggle with attendance, behavior, and grades, were matched with adult mentors called "Lunch Buddies." Students would eat lunch with their "Lunch Buddies" once a week and go on field trips with the One Plus One group. Overall 72% of students showed significant growth in their trouble areas in just over six months!
